



Ying Xu is the "Regents and Georgia Research Alliance Eminent Scholar" Chair of bioinformatics and computational biology and Professor in Biochemistry and Molecular Biology Department since 2003, and was the Founding Director of the Institute of Bioinformatics, the University of Georgia (UGA). He also holds a part-time Qianren (type B) Chair Professor position and a Changjiang Chair position at Jilin University of China. He received his Ph.D. degree in theoretical computer science from the University of Colorado at Boulder in 1991. He started his bioinformatics career in 1993 when he joined Oak Ridge National Lab. His current research interests are in (a) cancer systems biology and (b) microbial genomics and systems biology. He has over 300 publications (H-Index 55), including five books, and has given over 250 invited/contributed talks at conferences, research organizations and universities.
